


Humanitarian partners appeal for US\$1.18 billion to meet emergency needs in South Sudan for 2012.

At the beginning of the year, humanitarian partners appealed for \$763 million for South Sudan, Funding needs have increased significantly over the year. due to worsening food security and a continued arrival of refugees from Sudan's Blue Nile and South Kordofan states.

A legacy of civil war, political tensions with Sudan chronic underdevelopment impact heavily on the ability of the new state to provide basic services to humanitarian needs. renderina communities vulnerable to the effects of insecurity. displacement, returns, food shortages, outbreaks of disease and seasonal floods








Funding received by type of organization
